Chairwoman Tyson, Vice Chairman Peck, Ranking Member Corson, and Members of the Committee,

My name is **Daniel Diaz**, and I am submitting this testimony on behalf of **Citizens for Sound Money (C4SM)** in **strong support** of **Senate Bill 39 (SB39)**, **the Kansas Legal Tender Act**.

This year, 22 states have introduced sound money legislation aimed at eliminating taxation on gold and silver and ensuring that individuals and businesses have the right to use sound money in everyday transactions. Of these, 16 states are actively working to make gold and silver legal tender, with Kansas positioned to be a leader in this growing national movement.

Six states—Utah, Wyoming, Oklahoma, Arizona, Arkansas, and Louisiana—have already passed legal tender laws, and Idaho is now sending its legal tender legislation to the Governor's desk for final approval. Kansas now has the opportunity to join this movement and provide its citizens with the same financial protections against inflation and monetary instability.

Why SB39 is Critical for Kansas

Restoring Constitutional Money

SB39 aligns Kansas with **Article I, Section 10 of the U.S. Constitution**, which states that **no state shall make anything but gold and silver coin a tender in payment of debts**. By passing this bill, Kansas would **restore sound money principles** that have been eroded by the overreach of the federal government and the Federal Reserve's reckless monetary policies.

Protecting Kansans from Inflation & Economic Instability

Over the past few years, Americans have seen the dollar's purchasing power decline at an alarming rate. Inflation—driven by trillions of dollars in new money printing—has left Kansans struggling with higher prices for gas, food, housing, and basic goods. Gold and silver have historically served as a store of value, immune from the reckless devaluation that plagues fiat currency. Recognizing them as legal tender would provide Kansans with a real alternative to an unstable dollar.

✓ Ending Unfair Taxation on Gold & Silver

SB39 ensures that gold and silver are treated as money, not commodities. No one pays capital gains taxes when exchanging a \$20 bill for two \$10 bills—why should they be taxed for exchanging devalued dollars for gold and silver? Kansas can join the growing number of states eliminating this unfair taxation on sound money.

Strengthening Kansas's Economy & Financial Freedom

By removing tax burdens and recognizing gold and silver as legal tender, SB39 will encourage businesses and individuals to engage in commerce using sound money. It will also attract investors and savers looking to protect their wealth from inflation, making Kansas a hub for financial independence and sound money commerce.

Kansas Can Lead the Nation in Sound Money Policy

With **14 states still actively fighting to pass legal tender laws**, Kansas has the opportunity to be **on the leading edge of this movement**. SB39 would put Kansas in a **strong position alongside Wyoming, Utah, Oklahoma, Arizona, Arkansas, Louisiana, and soon, Idaho**, ensuring that citizens have access to stable, inflation-resistant money.

At Citizens for Sound Money, we are closely monitoring sound money legislation across the country, working with legislators, economists, and business leaders to help ensure these bills become law. We recognize the importance of restoring financial sovereignty and providing states with the tools to protect their citizens from inflation and monetary instability. Kansas is in a strong position to take the lead on this issue, and we are encouraged by the growing interest in sound money principles across the country.
