Subject:	SB 49—Attendance Center Needs Assessments, State Assessment Data and Identification of Fund Allocations

Senate Bill 49 would amend K.S.A. 72-1163 to require that each attendance center needs assessment be conducted by the local board of education and include input from board members, teachers, school site councils and school administrators and that board members receive certain state assessment data and identify allocations of money in the school district budget and budget summary.

Attendance Center Needs Assessment

Currently, local school boards are required to conduct an assessment of the needs of each attendance center in the school district. SB 428 would require that such assessments include input from board members, teachers, school site councils and school administrators. SB 49 would require that the needs assessment of the educational needs of each attendance center of the school district include input from local school board members, teachers employed by the school district, school site councils and attendance center administrators.

State Assessment Results

Additionally, SB 49 would also require that each member of the local school board annually receives the state assessment results for the school districts and such results would indicate the number of students who scored at each of the levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 on the state assessments.

Identification of Fund Allocations

Finally, the bill would require that any time moneys are allocated to a fund or reallocated, such allocation or reallocation be identified in the school district's budget and budget summary.



Effective Date

The bill would take effect on July 1, 2025, upon publication in the statute book.
