Chair Erickson and members of the Senate Education committee. Thank you for the opportunity to present opposition testimony on SB 47. USA Kansas appears in opposed on this legislation.

- The provisions in SB 47 violate local school boards' rights to oversee their districts by imposing unnecessary and disruptive procedures.
- This bill imposes meeting requirements on local boards of education that go beyond what is required of other public groups.
- The requirements in this bill goes beyond what is imposed upon other public legislative bodies to include the Kansas Legislature.
- This bill would allow a single board member the unlimited right to place new items on a board meeting agenda at any time. Currently a new item is added to the agenda when a request is made, the request is seconded and a majority of the board votes to add the item. This provision has the potential to erode the trust in the boards due to lack of transparency.
- School districts in Kansas already have policies in place for rules of order, public participation, and public hearings. The provisions in this bill usurps local control.
- The bill requires that board member emails be disclosed and publicized. The are cyber security issues with this provision.
- The bill provides for board members be given unlimited access to school district property any time the building is open. The right is currently given to the board as a whole not an individual member.

For these reasons United School Administrators of Kansas respectfully request that you not pass SB 47 out of committee.
