MEMORANDUM

Subject: SB 304—Born to Invest Act

Senate Bill 304 would enact the born to invest act to require the office of vital statistics to provide data to the office of the state treasurer for the distribution of informational materials regarding certain government-administered savings accounts.

SB 304 would require the state treasurer to determine the data necessary to distribute informational materials that describe the availability, purposes, advantages and enrollment procedures for the following government-administered savings accounts:

- Trump accounts, as established by section 530A of the federal internal revenue code, for children born on and after January 1, 2025;
- Postsecondary educational savings program accounts, as established by section 529 of the federal internal revenue code and K.S.A. 75-640 et seq.; and
- ABLE accounts, established by section 529A of the federal internal revenue code and K.S.A. 75-651.

Such data may include the name of the child, the name and mailing address of the child's parent or legal guardian or the date of the child's live birth. SB 304 would require the registrar of the office of vital statistics to provide:

- By September 1, 2026, any such data regarding children born prior to July 1, 2026, if such children are currently eligible for government-administered savings accounts and no corresponding death certificate has been issued for such children; and

- Within 90 days of issuance of a birth certificate, any such data regarding children born on and after July 1, 2026, so long as no corresponding death certificate has been issued for such children.

Data transmission would be in a secure electronic manner consistent with applicable federal and state law.

The treasurer would be required to maintain information regarding the availability, purposes and advantages of the government-administered savings accounts and any informational materials distributed by the state treasurer would be in a suitable form and manner for mail, including brochures, letters, inserts or other printed information. Such information is to be publicized on the state treasurer's website and through financial literacy education.

SB 304 would authorize the secretary of health and environment and the state treasurer to enter into interagency agreements to carry out the requirements of the bill.

Except as otherwise permitted, nothing in the bill would be construed to authorize disclosure of confidential or protected records or information.

SB 304 would take effect on July 1, 2026, upon publication in the statute book.
