SB 99 Proponent Testimony Senate Committee on Government Efficiency Requiring state agencies to certify full time employees paid from SGF Tanner Tempel –Deputy State Director, Americans for Prosperity Kansas February 12, 2025



Chairwoman Erickson and Members of the Committee:

Good morning, my name is Tanner Tempel, and I am here on behalf of Americans for Prosperity to express our support for Senate Bill No. 99. This legislation is a crucial step towards enhancing the efficiency and accountability of our state government.
