Subject: Letter of Support for Senate House Bill 204

The definition of "seal" as preventing public access to any information related to the case, warrant, or subpoena reinforces the bill's intent to safeguard personal information and maintain the integrity of legal proceedings.

I urge you and your colleagues to support this essential legislation. Ensuring confidentiality in these cases not only strengthens our justice system but also demonstrates our commitment to protecting the most vulnerable members of our community.
