Madam Chair and Committee,

I support this legislation; however, I believe it should be amended. One of the responsibilities of our government as a Constitutional Republic is to restrain evil doers. [1] Unfortunately, this necessary stance has been diluted or abdicated over the years as people desire more and more to avoid accountability. Our sight of the true purpose of government fades as we abandon the founding design of life, family, property and liberty, which is freedom with morality. [2] An individual's unalienable rights (imparted by God and NOT government) should be protected from all threats, both foreign and domestic, where the rule of Law in pursuance of the Constitution of the United States is a primary function of our government. [3]

To maintain order and provide security, strong initial penalties for crimes should be used to discourage criminal activity. To avoid this gateway to harder criminal behaviors, the "rod of government" should not be spared as a mitigative tool, just like the "rod" applied in love, by a father and a mother, in the home.
