## MEMORANDUM

Subject: Bill Brief on HB 2228 (As Introduced)

House Bill 2228 requires the secretary of corrections to assist inmates with obtaining identification and employment related documentation prior to release from custody.

The bill creates a new section of law that requires the secretary, within 9 months prior to the release of an inmate, to determine whether the inmate has current versions of certain documentation. If the secretary finds that the inmate does not have a certified copy of a birth certificate, a social security card or replacement social security card, or a driver's license issued pursuant to K.S.A. 8-243, if eligible, or an identification card issued pursuant to K.S.A. 8-1324 et seq., the secretary shall make a reasonable effort to provide the inmate with that documentation. If the secretary finds that the inmate does not have their vocational training record, their work record, any educational certifications or diplomas, or a current resume, the secretary shall provide the inmate with that documentation. The secretary shall coordinate with state agencies as necessary to gather the documentation, and all state agencies shall coordinate with the secretary to implement the provisions of the section.

The new section does not apply to inmates who are going to be released to the custody of another jurisdiction on a warrant or detainer or to inmates who are determined by the secretary to be physically or mentally unable to return to the workforce when released from custody.

The bill would take effect from and after publication in the statute book, July 1, 2025.
