**RE:** HB 2280, Kansas EMS Statute Modernization Legislation

On behalf of the Kansas Emergency Medical Services Association (KEMSA), I offer my testimony in support of HB 2280 as submitted. The proposed legislation represents a crucial update to our state's EMS statutes, aligning them with the current standards of practice and future innovations in emergency medical services.

This legislation proposal has been a collaborative endeavor between KEMSA and the Kansas Board of EMS. EMS stakeholders from across the state have helped fashion this statute revision. The proposed updates aim to increase EMS efficiency, expand the scope of practice, and allow for the integration of emerging technologies, ultimately benefiting the quality of care for Kansas residents. Examples include allowing EMTs to monitor saline locks, transmit serial EKGs, the ability to refer patients to alternate care sites and aligning practice with Mobile Integrated Healthcare (MIH) initiatives to better serve our communities. The bill also establishes alternate staffing for EMS agencies who are not subject to public 911 call. This will allow agencies to better address the influx of non-emergent transfers without the requirement of 24/7 staffing.

The proposed legislative changes have received broad support from EMS professionals and industry stakeholders across Kansas. I am pleased to inform you that all six (6) of the Kansas EMS Council Region have expressed their endorsement of this modernization effort. In addition, the Kansas Association of Fire Chiefs and Mid-America Regional Council Emergency Rescue have also offered their full support. They all recognize the importance of these updates in enhancing EMS service delivery across our communities.
