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**MEMORANDUM**

Subject: Bill Brief on Senate Bill 322

Senate Bill 322 removes the authority of the state board of pharmacy to authorize individuals to access the program database as delegate by rules and regulations.

Section 1 amends K.S.A. 65-1682, the definitions section for the prescription monitoring program act. Under current law, a delegate is allowed to access the prescription monitoring program database and is defined to include certain healthcare providers, death investigators or an individual authorized to access the program database by the board in rules and regulations. The bill strikes language allowing the board to authorize other individuals to access the program database by rules and regulations.

SB 322 would take effect on July 1, 2026, upon publication in the statute book.
