Subject: Bill Brief on Senate Bill 328

Senate Bill 328 permits a pharmacist to distribute epinephrine delivery systems to schools for emergency medicine kits and amends definitions related to medication in schools to allow for use of epinephrine delivery systems.

Section 1 amends K.S.A. 65-1680 to expand the types of pediatric-dose epinephrine that a pharmacist is allowed to distribute to a school for an emergency medication kit from solely auto-injectors to epinephrine delivery systems.

Section 2 amends K.S.A. 72-6282, the statute authorizing self-administration of certain medications by students to allow for epinephrine delivery systems.

Section 3 amends K.S.A. 72-6283, the statute allowing a school to maintain a stock supply of emergency medication, to expand the term “epinephrine auto-injector” to “epinephrine delivery system,” which means a device that is approved by the FDA which contains a premeasured dose of epinephrine and is used to administer epinephrine into the human body. Corresponding amendments are made throughout the bill to update the term “auto-injectors” to “delivery systems.”

SB 328 would take effect on July 1, 2026, upon publication in the statute book.
