

Senate Transportation Committee January 29, 2025 SB 17

Kansas Association of Counties Opponent Testimony – Written Only

Chairman Petersen and members of the Committee:

Thank you for allowing the Kansas Association of Counties to offer opponent testimony on SB 17, which would create an exception to weight and load limits for haulers of grain and other agricultural goods.

Counties in Kansas are required by statute to maintain roads and bridges within the county. In Kansas, there are about 140,000 center line miles of public roads. Kansas Counties maintain over 113,000 center line miles of road in Kansas. 87% of the county roads are unpaved.

Heavier loads on roads cause the roads to degrade more quickly, which drives up maintenance costs. This is particularly important given that the motor fuels tax revenues have remained relatively flat over the last several years.
