Informational testimony in support of Kansas FFA Distinctive License Plate (HB2201)

Chairman Peterson and esteemed members of the Transportation committee:

My name is Hayley Hines, I have been a Kansas FFA member for 5 years, and I am currently serving as the 2024-2025 Kansas FFA State Vice President. I stand in front of you today in support of House Bill 2201, which offers the installation of a FFA license plate. This bill would not only allow additional funds for the association, but it will create representation across the state for an organization that helps build the future leaders of tomorrow's agriculturalists.

My family's journey in the blue jacket started back in the 1950's. My great grandparents were members of the Olathe chapter, including my Granny.
