
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2401 by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2401 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2401 would allow prior convictions of a crime that have been determined to be unconstitutional by an appellate court to be used for criminal history scoring if the basis of determination of unconstitutionality is later overruled or reversed by an order or opinion of the Kansas Supreme Court or the United States Supreme Court.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill would have a minimal fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2401 is not reflected in *The FY 2026 Governor's Budget Report*.
