SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2419 by Representative McNorton

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2419 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2419 would provide an exemption to the Kansas Open Records Act for KPERS retirees. The bill would allow retired KPERS members to have identifying information restricted from public websites that identify home addresses or home ownership. This change would allow any KPERS retiree to file with a custodian of the record in question to have the identifying information restricted from public access on the affected website. The custodian would have ten business days of receipt of the request to comply with the removal request. The restriction would expire after five years and the KPERS retiree may file again with the custodian for a new request of restriction at any time.

The Division of the Budget estimates that any additional administrative cost, either to state agencies or other organizations, to comply with a restriction request from a KPERS retiree likely would be negligible.
