
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2436 by Representative Wikle, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2436 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2436 would provide immunity from criminal prosecution for individuals who render aid, including administering an emergency opioid antagonist, to someone in need of medical assistance as a result of the use of a controlled substance. The provisions of the bill would apply to the administration of expired emergency opioid antagonists that are up to ten years past the product's expiration date.

The Board of Indigents' Defense Services, the Judiciary, the Kansas Sentencing Commission, and the Board of Emergency Medical Services indicate that enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on agency operations. The League of Kansas Municipalities and the Kansas Association of Counties indicate that the bill would have no fiscal effect on local governments.
