SUBJECT: Revised Fiscal Note for HB 2460 by House Committee on Judiciary

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following revised fiscal note concerning HB 2460 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2460 would amend the Kansas Open Records Act to authorize members of the Legislature to have identifying information restricted from public access on public websites that are searchable by a keyword search and identify home addresses or home ownership.


The Kansas Public Disclosure Commission indicates enactment of the bill would have a minimal fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources. The Commission estimates that approximately five individuals would no longer register with the Commission, resulting in a minimal loss of revenue, and that lobbyist handbooks would have to be reprinted at a minimal one-time cost to the agency.

The Office of the Secretary of State indicates enactment of the bill would have a minimal fiscal effect that could be handled within existing resources. The Office notes that it is able to make voter registration home addresses non-public in its systems.

The Department of Revenue indicates enactment of the bill would have a minimal fiscal effect to make sure record custodians are maintaining compliance with the new guidelines, which could be absorbed within existing resources.

Legislative Administrative Services indicates enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the Legislature. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2460 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
