SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2484 by House Committee on Education


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2484 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2484 would amend the Kansas Promise Scholarship Program. The bill would eliminate the requirement that individuals reside in Kansas after completing the Program; however, the bill would clarify that individuals would still be required to work in Kansas and would clarify other work requirements as outlined in the bill. Under current law, the Kansas Promise Scholarship will expire on July 1, 2028. The bill would repeal the expiration date.

The Board of Regents states enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on the agency and notes that the Program would become permanent with the repeal of the expiration date.

The Division of the Budget notes that under current law for each fiscal year, appropriations made for the Program cannot exceed \$10.0 million. Included in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report* is \$10.0 million in both FY 2027 and FY 2028 from the State General Fund for the Kansas Promise Scholarship Program. If the bill is enacted, any funding for future fiscal years would be subject to appropriations.
