SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2508 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2508 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2508 would prohibit healthcare providers from prescribing medication, administering diagnostic tests, or conducting behavioral treatments to minors without parental consent, except in certain circumstances as outlined in the bill. The bill would take effect upon its publication in the statute book.


The Board of Optometry, the Behavioral Sciences Regulatory Board, the Dental Board, the Board of Nursing, and the Board of Healing Arts indicate enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect.

The Board of Emergency Medical Services indicates any fiscal effect resulting from the bill's enactment would be negligible. The Kansas State Department of Education states there would be no fiscal effect if the bill is enacted.

The Board of Pharmacy states if complaints and disciplinary cases increase, the Board would need increased expenditure authority for additional compliance staff and additional contractual hours with the Board's attorney; however, the Board did not estimate a fiscal effect.

The Kansas Association of School Boards indicates there would be no fiscal effect on school districts if the bill is enacted.
