
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2568 by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2568 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2568 would authorize the Department of Wildlife and Parks to adopt the proposed permanent administrative rules and regulations concerning fees, registration, and other changes as identified and described in the Department's economic impact statement to the Division of the Budget. The rules and regulations that are affected by the bill are motor vehicle permit fees and camping, utility, and other fees. The bill would be effective upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

The Department of Wildlife and Parks states that the passage of the bill would not change the revenues of the agency, as further action is required to increase fees. After the bill is passed, the Wildlife and Parks Commission would establish the new fees and vote to approve the increases. Then the Department would complete the rules and regulation process. Once the entire process is complete the agency's revenues are estimated to increase by \$4.6 million annually into the Parks Fee Fund. The agency is unsure of the timing of when the increases would go into effect. The agency used a five-year average of the fees and permits to estimate the total increase. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2658 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
