SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2587 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2587 is respectfully submitted to your committee.


HB 2587 would permit licensed private psychiatric hospitals that utilize the services of pharmacists to maintain an emergency medication kit under the supervision of a prescriber and pharmacist. The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services and the State Board of Pharmacy would be jointly responsible for adopting rules and regulations covering contents of the kit, procedures for control and accountability, recordkeeping, and storage of the kit.

According to the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS), enactment of HB 2587 would require KDADS staff to complete an annual on-site survey for compliance with the bill, which would be an additional site-visit from current bi-annual licensure inspection. KDADS would need a Registered Nurse level position to review annually and as needed for complaint allegations or adverse incidents compliance of emergency medication kits in conjunction with the Board of Pharmacy. KDADS estimates an increase in State General Fund operating expenditures for the additional position to include salary and benefits and other operating expenditures to be \$115,000 in FY 2027 and \$117,875 for FY 2028.

The Board of Pharmacy indicates that enactment of HB 2587 would have no fiscal effect on the Board. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2587 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
