SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2655 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2655 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2655 would allow any person who has completed the requirements of a specialty court program to petition a municipal court for the expungement of the conviction and related arrest records. The court would be allowed to waive all or part of the docket fees. The bill would also authorize the chief judge of each municipal court to establish a specialty court program.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2655 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.

The League of Kansas Municipalities indicates enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect that could be absorbed within existing resources.
