SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2664 by Representative Neelly, et al.

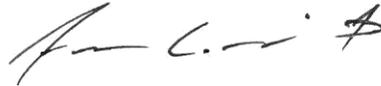
In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2664 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2664 would establish the Private Energy Campus and Industrial Host-Site Generation Act to enable and encourage private industrial self-generation that compliments rather than competes with electric public utilities. The bill would define a private energy campus and set out specific state policy declarations to authorize the sales of electricity and ancillary services to private industrial and data center enterprises located on a private energy campus without regulation of the Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC). The bill would allow the KCC to review contracts between regulated utilities and private energy campuses regarding emergency services and authorize an electric public utility company to enter into interconnection and energy services agreements with a private energy campus and would exempt a private energy campus from parallel generation and net metering requirements.

The Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board indicates that the enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on operations. However, enactment of the bill could increase resources required for review if there is also an increase in the technical and substantive nature of the review. The KCC indicates that the enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on its operations. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2664 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.

The League of Kansas Municipalities indicates that the enactment of the bill could decrease revenues for cities due to exempting parallel generation and net metering requirements. The Kansas Association of Counties indicates that the enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on counties.
