
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2727 by House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2727 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2727 would amend the Woman's Right-to-Know Act. The bill would allow plaintiffs to elect to limit recovery to statutory damages in the amount of \$5,000, together with recovery of any amounts paid by such plaintiff or on such plaintiff's behalf to the defendant in connection with any abortion sought from or performed by the defendant, along with reasonable attorney fees. The bill would specify that if a plaintiff elected such recovery, then the provisions of KSA 65-4901 through 65-4908, and amendments thereto, related to medical malpractice screening panels would not apply in such action.

According to the Office of Judicial Administration, enactment of HB 2727 would have a negligible fiscal effect on expenditures of the Judicial Branch, which could be handled within existing resources. The Office does not anticipate a fiscal effect on the revenues to the Judicial Branch or the State General Fund. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2727 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
