SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2765 by House Committee on Health and Human Services


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2765 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2765 would amend the Uniform Controlled Substances Act by adding and removing certain substances in Schedules I, III, and IV as outlined in the bill. The bill would also make conforming changes to the criminal code definition of “fentanyl-related substance.”

The Kansas Sentencing Commission indicates enactment of the bill would not have an effect on prison beds or admissions. The Department of Corrections states the bill’s enactment would not have a fiscal effect.

The Office of Judicial Administration states any fiscal effect resulting from the bill’s enactment could be absorbed within existing resources. The Board of Pharmacy states the bill’s enactment would not have a fiscal effect.
