SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 348 by Senate Committee on Utilities


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 348 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 348 would exempt any electric public utility that is a not-for-profit, wholly owned subsidiary of an electric cooperative public utility from the jurisdiction of the State Corporation Commission. The bill would establish certain exceptions and requirements for meetings concerning electric rates and provide the customers of the not-for-profit, wholly owned subsidiary of an electric cooperative public utility with the ability to petition the State Corporation Commission to investigate rates and order new rates, if appropriate.

The State Corporation Commission and the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board indicate that enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on operations.

The League of Kansas Municipalities indicates enactment of the bill could increase expenditures for municipalities to provide new information regarding utility rates, but a precise fiscal effect cannot be estimated. The Kansas Association of Counties indicates the enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on operations.
