SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 382 by Senate Committee on Education


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 382 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 382 would change current law regarding the administration and proctoring of statewide assessments for virtual school students. The bill would require the assessment to be administered by the virtual school at a time that is in the same range of dates assigned for the administration of assessment to students in the same school district as the virtual student.

The virtual student would be required to be monitored by an assessment proctor designated by the virtual school via camera for the duration of the assessment. If the assessment platform would provide integrated camera proctoring, the virtual school proctor may administer the assessment and monitor the student using the same device. If the assessment platform does not provide for integrated camera proctoring, the virtual student would have a second device with a functioning camera for the virtual school proctor to monitor the student. Upon the request of the virtual student, the virtual school may provide a student with a second device with a functioning camera for the virtual school proctor to monitor the virtual student.

The Department of Education and the Kansas Association of School Boards indicate that the enactment of SB 382 would have no fiscal effect.
