SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 399 by Senate Committee on Judiciary


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 399 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 399 would exempt an employee of the Judicial Branch or a district court who provides a standard form approved by the Kansas Supreme Court, the Office of Judicial Administration, the Judicial Council, or a judicial district to a member of the public from statutes regarding practicing law without a license. The bill specifies that an employee could rely on the assumption that the information provided by the member of the public is accurate and that the employee is not responsible for incorrect information entered onto the form by the public.

The Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on revenues and expenditures of the Judicial Branch that could be absorbed within existing resources.

The Office of the Attorney General and the Judicial Council indicate enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the agencies. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 399 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
