
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 430 by Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 430 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 430 would define “point-of-care testing” to mean laboratory-based capillary assays. The bill would allow physical therapists to perform some limited point-of-care laboratory testing. The bill would specify that permitted tests would include lactate and blood glucose if used for the purpose of obtaining information related to muscle metabolism, exercise tolerance, or rehabilitation status and would not include testing for medical conditions outside the scope of physical therapy practice. Other related requirements and restrictions on the testing, and facilities where testing is performed, would be detailed in the bill.

The State Board of Healing Arts reports that while enactment of SB 430 could result in some actionable complaints to the Board, the enactment of the bill would likely be manageable within existing resources. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 430 is not reflected in *The FY 2027 Governor's Budget Report*.
