

## HOUSE BILL No. 2584

1 AN ACT concerning drivers' licenses; relating to contents thereon;  
2 permitting a licensee to request that such licensee's mailing address be  
3 provided on a driver's license; amending K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 8-243 and  
4 repealing the existing section.

6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 8-243 is hereby amended to read as  
8 follows: 8-243. (a) (1) Upon payment of the required fee, the division shall  
9 issue to every applicant qualifying under the provisions of this act the  
10 driver's license as applied for by the applicant. Such license shall bear the  
11 class or classes of motor vehicles that the licensee is entitled to drive, a  
12 distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, the full legal name, date of  
13 birth, gender, address of principal residence, *or mailing address if*  
14 *requested by the licensee, and* a brief description of the licensee, *either: (1)*  
15 *A digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser-engraved photograph of*  
16 *the licensee, a facsimile of the signature of the licensee and the statement*  
17 *provided for in subsection (b). No driver's license shall be valid until it has*  
18 *been signed by the licensee. All drivers' licenses issued to persons under*  
19 *the age of 21 years shall be readily distinguishable from licenses issued to*  
20 *persons age 21 years or older. In addition, all drivers' licenses issued to*  
21 *persons under the age of 18 years shall also be readily distinguishable*  
22 *from licenses issued to persons age 18 years or older. The secretary of*  
23 *revenue shall implement a vertical format to make drivers' licenses issued*  
24 *to persons under the age of 21 more readily distinguishable.*

25 (2) (4) Except as otherwise provided, no driver's license issued by the  
26 division shall be valid until either:

27 (1)(i) A digital color image or photograph; or

28 (2)(ii) a laser-engraved photograph of such licensee has been taken  
29 and verified before being placed on the driver's license.

30 (B) The secretary of revenue shall prescribe a fee of not more than  
31 \$8, and upon the payment of such fee, the division shall cause *either: (1) A*  
32 *digital color image or photograph; or (2) a laser-engraved* *the photograph*  
33 *of such applicant to be placed on the driver's license.*

34 (3) Upon payment of such fee prescribed by the secretary of revenue,  
35 *pursuant to this subsection, plus payment of the fee required by K.S.A. 8-*

1 246, and amendments thereto, for issuance of a new license, the division  
2 shall issue to such licensee a new license—containing either: (1) A digital  
3 color image or photograph; or (2) a laser-engraved photograph of such  
4 licensee.

5 (4) A driver's license that does not contain the principal *or mailing*  
6 address as required may be issued to persons who are program participants  
7 pursuant to K.S.A. 75-455, and amendments thereto, upon payment of the  
8 fee required by K.S.A. 8-246, and amendments thereto. All Kansas drivers'  
9 licenses and identification cards shall have physical security features  
10 designed to prevent tampering, counterfeiting or duplication of the  
11 document for fraudulent purposes. The secretary of revenue shall  
12 incorporate common machine-readable technology into all Kansas drivers'  
13 licenses and identification cards.

14 (b) A Kansas driver's license issued to any person 16 years of age or  
15 older who indicated on the person's application that the person wished to  
16 make a gift of all or any part of the body of the licensee in accordance with  
17 the revised uniform anatomical gift act, K.S.A. 65-3220 through 65-3244,  
18 and amendments thereto, shall have the word "Donor" placed on the front  
19 of the licensee's driver's license.

20 (c) Any person who is deaf or hard of hearing may request that the  
21 division issue to such person a driver's license—~~which~~ *that* is readily  
22 distinguishable from drivers' licenses issued to other drivers and upon such  
23 request the division shall issue such license. Drivers' licenses issued to  
24 persons who are deaf or hard of hearing and under the age of 21 years shall  
25 be readily distinguishable from drivers' licenses issued to persons who are  
26 deaf or hard of hearing and 21 years of age or older. Upon satisfaction of  
27 subsection (a), the division shall issue a receipt of application permitting  
28 the operation of a vehicle consistent with the requested class, if there are  
29 no other restrictions or limitations, pending the division's verification of  
30 the information and production of a driver's license.

31 (d) A driver's license issued to a person required to be registered  
32 under K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto, shall be assigned a  
33 distinguishing number by the division—~~which~~ *that* will readily indicate to  
34 law enforcement officers that such person is a registered offender. The  
35 division shall develop a numbering system to implement the provisions of  
36 this subsection.

37 (e) (1) Any person who is a veteran may request that the division  
38 issue to such person a driver's license that shall include the designation  
39 "VETERAN" displayed on the front of the driver's license at a location to  
40 be determined by the secretary of revenue. In order to receive a license  
41 described in this subsection, the veteran shall provide a copy of the  
42 veteran's DD form 214, NGB form 22 or equivalent discharge document  
43 showing character of service as honorable or general under honorable

1 conditions.

2 (2) As used in this subsection, "veteran" means a person who served  
3 in the active military, naval, air or space service, including those groups  
4 and individuals listed under 38 C.F.R. § 3.7, and who was discharged or  
5 released therefrom under an honorable discharge or a general discharge  
6 under honorable conditions.

7 (3) The director of vehicles may adopt any rules and regulations  
8 necessary to carry out the provisions of this subsection.

9 (f) (1) Any person who submits satisfactory proof to the director of  
10 vehicles, on a form provided by the director, that such person needs  
11 assistance with cognition, including, but not limited to, persons with  
12 autism spectrum disorder, may request that the division issue to such  
13 person a driver's license; that shall note such impairment on the driver's  
14 license at a location to be determined by the secretary of revenue.

15 (2) Satisfactory proof that a person needs assistance with cognition  
16 shall include a statement from a person licensed to practice the healing arts  
17 in any state, an advanced practice registered nurse licensed under K.S.A.  
18 65-1131, and amendments thereto, a licensed physician assistant or a  
19 person clinically licensed by the Kansas behavioral sciences regulatory  
20 board certifying that such person needs assistance with cognition.

21 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 8-243 is hereby repealed.

22 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its  
23 publication in the statute book.
