1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2026, June 30, 2027, June 30, 2028, June 30, 2029, and June
3 30, 2030, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital
4 improvement projects, assessments and fees; authorizing certain
5 transfers; imposing certain restrictions and limitations; directing or
6 authorizing certain disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the
7 foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 74-
8 50,107, 74-99b34, 75-6707, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2989, 79-3425i, 79-
9 34,171, 79-4804 and 82a-955 and repealing the existing sections.

11 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

12 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2026, June 30,
13 2027, June 30, 2028, June 30, 2029, and June 30, 2030, appropriations are
14 hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed and transfers,
15 capital improvement projects, assessments, fees, receipts, disbursements,
16 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or
17 authorized as provided in this act.

18 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

22 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-
23 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

24 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
25 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

36 on pensions, investments and benefits, joint committee on state-tribal

(a) On the effective date of this act, notwithstanding the provisions of sections 13 or 14 of chapter 97 of the 2023 Session Laws of Kansas, for fiscal years 2026 and 2027, the total of all amounts transferred from the state general fund to the build Kansas matching grant fund shall not exceed \$115,000,000.

Pregnancy compassion awareness program.....\$3,000,000

Provided, That expenditures shall be made by the above agency from such account during fiscal year 2027 to continue the statewide program, previously known as the alternatives to abortion program, to enhance and increase resources that promote childbirth instead of abortion to women facing unplanned pregnancies and to offer a full range of services, including pregnancy support centers, adoption assistance and maternity homes: *Provided further;* That the program shall include only the following services: Counseling and mentoring; care coordination for prenatal services, including connecting clients to health programs; providing educational materials and information about pregnancy and parenting; referrals to county and social service programs, including child care, transportation, housing and state and federal benefit programs; classes on life skills, budgeting, parenting, stress management, job training, job placement and obtaining a GED certificate; providing material items, including, but not limited to, car seats, cribs, maternity clothes, infant diapers and formula; and support groups in maternity homes: *And provided further;* That program services shall be made available to any Kansas resident who is a pregnant woman, the biological father of an unborn child, the biological or adoptive parent or legal guardian of a child 24 months of age or younger, a program participant who has experienced the loss of a child or a parent or legal guardian of a pregnant child who is a program participant: *And provided further;* That the provision and delivery

1 of services under the program shall be dependent on participant needs as
2 assessed by the nonprofit organization providing the services and not
3 otherwise prioritized by any state agency: *And provided further*, That
4 program services shall be available to participants only during pregnancy
5 and continuing for up to 24 months after birth of the child: *And provided*
6 *further*, That the state treasurer shall continue to contract with the nonprofit
7 organization that was awarded such contract in fiscal year 2026 to provide
8 services under the pregnancy compassion awareness program, and such
9 nonprofit organization shall subcontract with existing pregnancy centers,
10 adoption agencies, maternity homes and social service organizations to
11 provide program services to promote childbirth instead of abortion: *And*
12 *provided further*, That such contract extension shall be for a term not
13 longer than one year: *And provided further*, That the selected contractor
14 and any subcontractors may provide services in addition to the enumerated
15 program services, but such services shall not be funded through the
16 pregnancy compassion awareness program: *And provided further*, That the
17 state treasurer shall include as a condition of the contract extension with
18 the nonprofit organization selected to provide program services: (1) The
19 assessment of an administrative fine for failure to satisfy program
20 requirements, including required reporting, or for the intentional or
21 reckless misuse of any funds awarded by the terms of such contract, and
22 such fine shall be in the amount of 10% of the funds awarded by the terms
23 of such contract and shall be deposited into the state treasury in
24 accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments
25 thereto, to the credit of the state general fund; and (2) that such nonprofit
26 organization shall submit a report to the legislature and the state treasurer
27 on or before June 30, 2027, on the administration of the program during

31 educational services or job training and placement activities; the number
32 of newborns who were born to program participants; the number of such

 40 reimbursable expenses properly submitted in reimbursement requests: *And*

1 the request: *And provided further*, That the above agency may process

23 psychotherapist or licensed psychiatrist or psychologist: *And provided*
24 *further*, That each individual with a diagnosis of ASD or sub-threshold
25 trauma symptoms shall be authorized for reimbursement for a maximum
26 of 12 sessions, provided that additional reimbursements may be authorized
27 with documentation of ongoing functional impairment as determined by a
28 licensed psychiatrist or psychologist: *And provided further*, That each
29 individual with a diagnosis of PTSD shall be authorized for reimbursement
30 for a maximum of 12 sessions for treatment consistent with a top rating

32 analysis of treatment recommendations in effect on the effective date of
33 this act: *And provided further*, That additional reimbursements may be
34 authorized with a required periodic reassessment of functional

37 dissatisfaction unrelated to a qualifying critical incident; preventive or
38 wellness counseling absent trauma exposure; or conditions lacking a
39 precipitating work-related event, unless a recurrence or exacerbation from
40 prior qualifying event: *And provided further*, That this proviso applies only
41 to treatment reimbursement: *And provided, however*, That this program
42 does not establish permanent impairment or disability benefits or
43 reimburse for loss of wages or treatment provided prior to July 1, 2026, or

1 reimbursement requests received after June 30, 2027: *And provided,*
2 *however;* That reimbursement shall not be provided for any cost of covered
3 services covered by any insurance or worker's compensation coverage of
4 the first responder or such responder's agency: *And provided further;* That
5 costs not reimbursed through insurance coverage or worker's
6 compensation coverage shall be eligible for reimbursement by this
7 program: *And provided further;* That the above agency shall create a form
8 for submitting an initial claim of reimbursement to include: (i) A statement
9 of the qualifying critical incident leading to their covered condition
10 including the date, time, location and description of the qualifying critical

12 event; (iii) a signed document from a licensed psychiatrist or psychologist
13 containing the diagnosis of the covered condition and the authorized
14 diagnosis guide used to make the diagnosis and a statement confirming
15 that the duty-related qualifying critical event reported by the first
16 responder was a precipitating or prevailing factor for the diagnosis; and
17 (iv) an affidavit signed by the emergency responder that all information is
18 truthful and accurate: *And provided further;* That the above agency shall
19 create a form for submitting subsequent claims of reimbursement for
20 additional therapy services, counseling services or pharmaceuticals to
21 include a statement from the first responder that the services provided
22 were directly related to treatment recommended to address the condition
23 diagnosed in the initial reimbursement request and a statement or invoice

25 may require additional information as necessary to properly process and
26 arrange payment of the reimbursable expenses submitted for both initial

42 account shall be accumulated and invested as provided in this section to
43 provide an ongoing source of funds, which shall be used for economic

1 development activities in Kansas, including, but not limited to, continuing
2 appropriations or demand transfers for programs and projects, which shall
3 include, but are not limited to, specific community infrastructure projects
4 in Kansas that stimulate economic growth.

5 (e) Except as provided in subsection (f), the director of investments
6 may invest and reinvest moneys credited to the state economic
7 development initiatives fund in accordance with investment policies
8 established by the pooled money investment board under K.S.A. 75-4232,
9 and amendments thereto, in the pooled money investment portfolio. All
10 moneys received as interest earned by the investment of the moneys
11 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be
12 deposited in the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic
13 development endowment account of such fund.

14 (f) Moneys credited to the Kansas economic development
15 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund
16 may be invested in government guaranteed loans and debentures as
17 provided by law in addition to the investments authorized by subsection
18 (e) or in lieu of such investments. All moneys received as interest earned
19 by the investment under this subsection of the moneys credited to the
20 Kansas economic development endowment account shall be deposited in
21 the state treasury and credited to the Kansas economic development
22 endowment account of the state economic development initiatives fund.

23 (g) Except as provided further, in each fiscal year, the director of
24 accounts and reports shall make transfers in equal amounts on July 15 and
25 January 15 that in the aggregate equal \$2,000,000 from the state economic
26 development initiatives fund to the state water plan fund created by K.S.A.
27 82a-951, and amendments thereto. During fiscal year 2026, the aggregate
28 amount transferred from the state economic development initiatives fund
29 to the state water plan fund shall equal \$2,921,417. No other moneys
30 credited to the state economic development initiatives fund shall be used
31 for: (1) Water-related projects or programs, or related technical assistance;
32 or (2) any other projects or programs, or related technical assistance that
33 meet one or more of the long-range goals, objectives and considerations
34 set forth in the state water resource planning act.

2 historic site if the request for funding is made by a nonprofit organization
