1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending  
2 June 30, 2026, June 30, 2027, June 30, 2028, June 30, 2029, and June  
3 30, 2030, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital  
4 improvement projects, assessments and fees; authorizing certain  
5 transfers; imposing certain restrictions and limitations; directing or  
6 authorizing certain disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the  
7 foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 74-  
8 50,107, 74-99b34, 75-6707, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2989, 79-3425i, 79-  
9 34,171, 79-4804 and 82a-955 and repealing the existing sections.

11 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

12 Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2026, June 30,  
13 2027, June 30, 2028, June 30, 2029, and June 30, 2030, appropriations are  
14 hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed and transfers,  
15 capital improvement projects, assessments, fees, receipts, disbursements,  
16 procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or  
17 authorized as provided in this act.

18 (b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate  
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by  
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the  
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

22 (c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-  
23 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

24 (d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the  
25 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

18 from moneys appropriated from the state general fund or from any special

20 during the 2027 regular session of the legislature short-range wireless  
21 technology to transmit live audio of the house of representatives and the  
22 senate chambers during such chambers' session with access to such audio  
23 limited to approved legislator devices or otherwise allow for bluetooth  
24 connection and provide an independent internet network for such  
25 technology and access to such network be limited to legislators.
