**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2393**

As Amended by House Committee of the Whole

**Brief\***

HB 2393, as amended, would extend the Judicial Branch surcharge on various docket fees through June 30, 2030. [Note: 2025 SB 125 extended the sunset date to June 30, 2027. Pursuant to 2022 HB 2541, the surcharge on docket fees received are deposited into the State General Fund.] The bill would also make technical changes by removing outdated statutory references and effective dates.

**Background**

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Appropriations at the request of Representative Waymaster.

***House Committee on General Government Budget***

In the House Committee hearing on March 3, 2025, no testimony was provided. Representatives of the Judicial Branch responded to questions. In response to questions, the representatives clarified that although several statutes within the bill authorize the Supreme Court to impose a surcharge on docket fees for the purposes of funding the costs of non-judicial personnel, current law promulgates that the surcharges received be deposited into the State General Fund (SGF).

### ***House Committee of the Whole***

The House Committee of the Whole made a technical amendment to the bill to replace instances of “2025” with “2026.”

### **Fiscal Information**

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, the Office of Judicial Administration indicates enactment of the bill would not have a fiscal effect on the Judicial Branch because the fees authorized in the bill would be remitted to the SGF. [*Note:* In FY 2024, district court surcharge revenue totaled \$7.3 million, and municipal court surcharge revenue totaled \$262,093. In FY 2025, combined district and municipal court surcharge revenue totaled \$8.6 million.]

Any fiscal effect associated with enactment of the bill is not reflected in *The FY 2026 Governor’s Budget Report*.
