SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 322

As Recommended by Senate Committee on
Public Health and Welfare

Brief*

SB 322 would remove the ability of the State Board of Pharmacy (Board) to maintain the list of individuals authorized to access the Prescription Monitoring Program database, K-TRACS, through rules and regulations.

Background

The bill was introduced by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations (JCARR).

Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare

In the Senate Committee hearing, written-only **neutral** testimony was provided by a representative of the Board. The testimony provided a general overview of K-TRACS and submission of a proposed regulation to JCARR in 2025, noting that the regulation was not adopted by the Board.

No other testimony was provided.

On February 3, 2026, Senator Tyson, a member of JCARR, provided the Senate Committee additional background on the JCARR hearing in 2025.

The Senate Committee recommended the bill be placed on the Consent Calendar.
