Dear Chairperson Schwartz:

Thank you for the opportunity to discuss an issue of concern to the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism (KDWPT). The Department has a need to include a proviso in both the FY 2012 supplemental appropriation bill and the FY 2013 appropriation bill. The proviso will allow the KDWPT to adjust for federal aid program expenditures at the close of a fiscal year. This proviso will address the program expenditures associated with the Travel and Tourism program.

In the mid-1990's, the KDWPT addressed an issue related to the diversion of wildlife federal aid funds for inappropriate uses associated with non-federal aid programs. One component of the settlement with the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) was that the KDWPT would have the ability to adjust expenditures between programs (Wildlife, Parks, Boating) to assure that wildlife funds were only used for expenditures for wildlife programs. Since the 1996 Legislative Session, the appropriation bills for the KDWPT have included language allowing the Department to adjust program expenditures at the end of a fiscal as necessary in order to comply with requirements established by the USFWS. This language has been attached to the Wildlife Fee Fund, Parks Fee Fund, and the Boating Fee Fund (see attached language).

The KDWPT now has a need to include such language to a fund used for the Travel and Tourism Program. The FY 2013 appropriation bill (SB 194 as amended by HCOW) included the requested language on the EDIF fund appropriation for travel and tourism operation expenditures. The Department of Administration has reviewed the approved language and considers it inappropriate and requested the Division of the Budget to have the language stricken from the bill. The use of the EDIF fund, which is not used solely by the KDWPT, as the source to correct program expenditures cannot be done.

Therefore, the KDWPT is requesting that the FY 2012 supplemental appropriation language and the FY 2013 appropriation language to be included in HB 2768 for the KDWPT be amended to delete the current language as attached to the EDIF travel and tourism operating expenditures account, as included in SB 294 as amended by the HCOW, and utilize the attached language. This language will allow the Department to use the Publication and other sales fund in lieu of the EDIF fund for the purpose of correcting program expenditures in order to comply with federal aid program requirements. If you or members of the Committee have any questions, please advice.

KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, PARKS AND TOURISM

(a) Any unencumbered balance in the state parks operating expenditures account of the state general fund in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013.

(b) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state economic development initiatives fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, the following:

Operating expenditures.....\$3,446,884

Provided, That any unencumbered balance in the operating expenditures account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013: Provided, however, That expenditures from this account for official hospitality shall not exceed \$1,000: provided further, That, in addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be made by the above agency from the operating expenditures account for fiscal year 2013, expenditures shall be made by the above agency from the operating expenditures account for fiscal year 2013 to include a provision on the calendar year 2013 applications for hunting licenses, fishing licenses and annual park permits for the applicant to make a voluntary contribution of \$2 or more to support the annual licenses issued to Kansas disabled veterans, annual licenses issued to Kansas national guard members, and annual park permits issued to Kansas national guard members: And provided further, That all moneys received as voluntary contributions to support the annual licenses issued to Kansas disabled veterans, annual licenses issued to Kansas national guard members, and annual park permits issued to Kansas national guard members shall be deposited in the state treasury in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto, to the credit of the free licenses and permits fund.

State parks operating expenditures.....\$2,300,871

Provided, That any unencumbered balance in the state parks operating expenditures account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013.

Travel and tourism operating expenditures......\$1,858,634

Provided, That additional expenditures may be made from the travel and tourism operating expenditures account for fiscal year 2013 for the purposes of compensating federal aid program expenditures if necessary in order to comply with requirements established by the United States fish and wildlife service for the utilization of federal aid funds: provided

Provided, That all moneys in the reimbursement for annual licenses issued to national guard members account shall be expended to pay the wildlife fee fund for the cost of fees for annual hunting and annual fishing licenses issued for the calendar year 2013 to Kansas army or air national guard members, which licenses are hereby authorized to be issued without charge to such members in accordance with policies and procedures prescribed by the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism therefor and subject to the limitation of the moneys appropriated and available in the reimbursement for annual licenses issued to national guard members account to pay the wildlife fee fund for such licenses: Provided, however, That no other hunting or fishing licenses or permits shall be eligible to be paid from this account: provided further, That any unencumbered balance in the reimbursement for annual licenses issued to national guard members account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013.

Provided, That all moneys in the reimbursement for annual park permits issued to national guard members account shall be expended to pay the parks fee fund for the cost of fees for annual park vehicle permits issued for the calendar year 2013 to Kansas army or air national guard members, which annual park vehicle permits are hereby authorized to be issued without charge to such members in accordance with policies and procedures prescribed by the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism therefor and subject to the limitation of the moneys appropriated and available in the reimbursement for annual park permits issued to national guard members account to pay the parks fee fund for such permits: Provided, however, That not more than one annual park vehicle permit per family shall be eligible to be paid from this account: provided further, That any unencumbered balance in the reimbursement for annual park permits issued to national guard members account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013.

Provided, That all moneys in the reimbursement for annual licenses

issued to Kansas disabled veterans account shall be expended to pay the wildlife fee fund for the cost of fees for annual hunting and annual fishing licenses issued for the calendar year 2013 to Kansas disabled veterans, which licenses are hereby authorized to be issued without charge to such veterans in accordance with policies and procedures prescribed by the secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism therefor and subject to the limitation of the moneys appropriated and available in the reimbursement for annual licenses issued to Kansas disabled veterans account to pay the wildlife fee fund for such licenses: Provided, however, That to qualify for such license without charge, the resident disabled veteran shall have been separated from the armed services under honorable conditions, have a disability certified by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs as being service connected and such service connected disability is equal to or greater than 30%: provided further, That no other hunting or fishing licenses or permits shall be eligible to be paid from this account: And provided further, That any unencumbered balance in the reimbursement for annual licenses issued to Kansas disabled veterans account in excess of \$100 as of June 30, 2012, is hereby reappropriated for fiscal year 2013.
