I'm Jennifer Yochum, and I'm a resident of Lawrence, Kansas. I'm here today to speak on behalf of thousands of Kansas' consumers who support the Uncork Kansas bill.

I believe consumers should be able to choose where we purchase beer, wine or other alcoholic beverages. Updating the current laws would allow us to buy alcoholic beverages in grocery and convenience stores. And, it would permit us to purchase food items, such as chips, ice and mixers, in liquor stores.

The liquor laws we have now require us to make two trips if we want to buy groceries and get a bottle of wine for dinner. That wastes precious time. I think I speak for many residents when I say I don't want the government to start dictating and controlling values, and I don't need the state telling me what is and isn't appropriate for my family.
