I am unable to attend the hearing regarding the motion to amend HB 2446 on Thursday, March 15, 2012. Please accept this written testimony in my absence.

I am of the opinion renewable projects not only provide a means of enhancing sources of environmentally clean production of energy, they are and need to continue to be in the mix of the various types of existing sources of energy production, destine to meet future demands for energy. With energy demand continuing to increase at an accelerated rate, and Kansas being ranked 2nd in the Nation as a favorable source for wind energy, I feel no opportunities should be missed to encourage renewable energy sources, since they have and will continue to result in jobs and economic development growth.
