My name is Laura Cohen and I am a social work student at the University of Kansas. I want to show my support for SB 410 because I truly feel that it is important to identify dyslexia in students at a young age. This bill states that a child who has been diagnosed with dyslexia shall receive best practices available by the school district. Dyslexia is different from other reading disorders; therefore it should be treated differently as well. I agree with the proponent that schools should be required to screen students from pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, first, and second grade. Then there can be proper steps taken to make sure that each child has an equal opportunity to learn in school.

I work for the Office of Students in Transition for one of the districts in Missouri and I work first-hand with students who cannot read.
