Written Testimony before Senate Elections Committee in Support of Senate Bill 102 by Carol Williams, Executive Director January 26, 2012

Senate Bill 102, with its balloon amendments, is a recommendation made by the Governmental Ethics Commission in its 2011 Annual Report and Recommendations. Senate Bill 102 would increase the fees candidates, political action committees and lobbyists are required to pay into the Commission's fee fund.

As background information, the Commission became a fee agency in 1991. The legislature established a fee fund for the Commission to provide supplemental funding for additional staff and other operating expenditures necessitated by legislation which brought all county and first class city candidates under the purview of the Campaign Finance Act. Fees were increased by the Kansas Legislature in 1994 and again in 2000.

Over the past decade, approximately one-third of the Commission's operations have been funded through the agency's fee fund. Recently, the Legislature has begun to use more and more of the Commission's fee fund to offset general fund appropriations. This year, 38% of the agency's operations will be funded through the fee fund. In FY 2013, 40% of the agency's appropriations will be funded through its fee fund. If fees are not increased, the Commission's fee fund will be depleted in FY 2015. To sustain the Commission's current level of operations past FY 2014, the Commission urges your support of SB 102.
