



Chair Brungardt and Senators of the Committee,

I am Philip Bradley representing the Kansas Licensed Beverage Assn., the men and women, in the hospitality industry, who own, manage and work in Kansas bars, breweries, clubs, caterers, hotels and restaurants where beverage alcohol is served. These are the over 3000 places you frequent, enjoy and the tens of thousands of employees that are glad to serve you. Thank you for the opportunity to speak today.

We ask this committee not to advance HB 2340 and penalize the Casinos this measure targets. Instead we ask for you to equalize the current ban.

That is accomplished by leaving existing statutes and then also applying the exemption only to establishments that meet specific criteria. Those could include establishing a license and requiring those for whom the ban has harmed to be granted that license if they qualified.

Such a class of establishments would be a "Smoking Establishment", similar to a "cigar bar" exemption. *This exemption exists in most statewide bans including California*. With a separate permit and requirements, such as adequate signage, time limitations and/or age restrictions to make sure all who approach and enter have the information to make a rational choice knowing that by entering or working here they have the expectation of being exposed to environmental smoke.

I realize that you are not re-addressing the whole issue of bans so I will not expand in that area other than to ask that if you do now or in the future, to please be allowed to offer you further current information.

We again ask that you not advance this bill in its current form. And ask that you amend it in the manner described above and pass the amended measure out of the committee
