A Megapolitan Area:

- 1. Combines at least two, but may include dozens of existing metropolitan areas.
- 2. Totals more than 10 million projected residents by 2040/
- 3. Derives from contiguous metropolitan and micropolitan areas.
- 4. Constitutes an "organic" cultural region with a distinct history and identity.
- 5. Occupies a roughly similar physical environment.
- 6. Links large centers through major transportation infrastructure.
- 7. Forms a functional urban network via goods and service flows.
- 8. Creates a usable geography that is suitable for large-scale regional planning.
- 9. Lies within the United States.
- 10. Consists of counties as the most basic unit.
