HB 2131–Misclassification of employees. No hearing.

HB 2211–Creating a preference for contracts for the performance of any job or service by a disabled veteran business. No hearing.

HB 2222-Labor organizations; persons prohibited from unionizing. No hearing.

HB 2235-Vehicle title loans; regulations. No hearing.

<u>HB 2244–Continuing education for plumbing, electrical and mechanical licensees</u>. No hearing.

HB 2256–Contracts with small minority businesses. No hearing.

HB 2341-Requiring certain beverage containers to be redeemable. No hearing.

There are currently no Senate bills in committee or bills in conference committee.

Chairperson Brown asked the members if there were any committee bill introductions.
