Representative O'Hara introduced a bill on the governing structures of the Kansas High school Activity Association, KSHSAA.

The Chairman called the committee's attention to **HB 2422–Personal and family protection act**; **corrections officers.** 

Representative Rubin moved an amendment to page 3, line 39 to read, "or a corrections officer employed by the Federal Bureau of Prisons", Representative Gregory seconded. Motion carried.

Representative O'Brian moved, Representative Huebert seconded, to pass HB 2422 favorably for passage as amended. Motion carried.

The Chairman called the committee's attention to **HB 2353–Personal and family protection act**; **amendments.** 

Representative Knox introduced the amendment known as Knox 1 (<u>Attachment 1</u>). He said that it deals with concealed carry in buildings. Therefore, the change from facilities or premises to the word "building". Public areas that have no security cannot post against concealed carry. The amendment requires buildings with both public and restricted access entrances to provide adequate security at the public entrances to prevent the carrying of a concealed handgun.

There was some discussion about the wording of the amendment.

The Chairman called for discussion of the Knox 2 (<u>Attachment 2</u>) and the Seiwert Amendment (<u>Attachment 3</u>). Representative Knox said the problem is the need to secure the gun when it is in the dormitory. A discussion about the meaning of the amendments took place.

The Chairman called upon the committee to discuss the Hospital Amendment (Attachment 4). Chad
