The Chairman opened the hearing on **SB 387–Qualifications of the state fire marshal.**

Mike Heim said the bill amends the statute dealing with the qualifications of the person that holds the office of State Fire Marshal. It strikes some requirements that they have knowledge of building construction. The new requirement is that any person appointed to State Fire Marshal have not less than five years experience in fire prevention and inspections, safety inspection or investigation or any combination thereof.

Terry L. Maple presented testimony as a proponent of <u>SB 387</u> (<u>Attachment 1</u>). He said that <u>SB 387</u> would broaden the "five years experience" requirement to include "fire prevention and inspection, safety inspection or investigation, or any combination thereof". Also the knowledge of building construction was removed from the statute. These amendments allow the consideration of candidates who possess a broader variety of skill sets potentially vital to the operation of the Office of State Fire Marshal.
