MINUTES OF THE HOUSE FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Steven R. Brunk at 1:58 p.m. on March 27, 2012, in Room 346-S of the Capitol.

Ron Hein introduced a Resolution asking KDHE for a study on tobacco harm reduction. It was received without objection.

The Chairman called on the committee to work <u>HB 2686–Establishing a program for drug screening</u> for cash assistance recipients.

<u>Representative Gregory moved, Representative Kiegerl seconded to pass HB 2686 out favorably for passage.</u>

<u>Representative Gregory moved, Representative Rubin seconded to pass his amendment</u> (Attachment 1). There was some committee discussion on the amendment. <u>Representative Rubin withdrew his second</u>. <u>Representative Loganbill seconded the motion</u>. The motion failed. We are back on the base bill.

<u>Representative Howell moved, Representative Wolfe Moore seconded his amendment to strike on page 12,</u> <u>lines 22-26 (Attachment 2)</u>. Representative Gregory said that this would not break the bank. <u>The motion</u> <u>carried.</u> We are back on the bill as amended

<u>Representative Rubin moved, Representative Huebert seconded the Rubin amendment (Attachment 3).</u> <u>Representative Gatewood made a substitute motion, seconded by Representative Loganbill to change the</u> <u>date on page 12, line 34 to the year 2012. The motion carried.</u> We are back on the bill as amended.

<u>Representative Wolfe Moore moved, Representative Gatewood seconded her amendment to insert</u> <u>language on page 12 line 5</u> (Attachment 4).

<u>Representative Kiegerl made a substitute motion, Representative Howell seconded that if they failed the</u> <u>drug test they must pay for the second test and be refunded if negative. The motion carried.</u> We are back on the base bill as amended.

The Chairman moved, seconded by Representative Patton to insert the language of HB 2686 as amended

into SB 275. SB 275 is a shell because the language in it was inserted into SB 288. <u>The motion carried.</u> We are back on House substitute for $\underline{SB 275}$ as amended.

<u>Representative Gregory moved, Representative Holmes seconded to move SB 275 out favorably as</u> <u>amended. The motion carried.</u>

The Chairman called on the committee to work <u>HB 2575–Kansas immigration accountability act; state agencies; state contractors.</u>

Representative Brunk introduced his balloon amendment (<u>Attachment 5</u>). The balloon contained the entire language of the bill. The balloon requires some oversight of the e-verify program. *Representative Rubin moved* **HB 2575** *favorbly for passage, Representative Bowers seconded.*

<u>Representative Rubin moved, Representative O'Hara seconded to insert the language of HB 2577–</u> <u>Enrollment and participation in an e-verify program by business and governmental entities; penalties,</u> <u>into HB 2575.</u> Representative Brunk asked if the 25% penalty was doable. Representative Rubin explained the concept of liquidated damages and said the percent could be changed.

<u>Representative Goico made a substitute motion, seconded by Representative Wolfe-Moore to insert the</u> <u>language of HB 2712– Kansas workers and community partnership act, undocumented aliens and HB</u> <u>2577 into HB 2575.</u> Representative Brunk said that he had hoped to do something simple. Representative Rubin was opposed to the motion, especially opposed to <u>HB 2712.</u> Representative Goico said that <u>HB 2575</u> was constitutional. Representative Rubin said he thought that the motion was out of order. <u>Representative Seiwert made a motion to table the motion, seconded by Representative Boman.</u> <u>The motion to table carried</u>.

The Chairman called upon the committee to work <u>SB 299–Alcoholic beverages; creating a public venue</u> <u>license.</u> Mike Heim explained that this was a new type of license.

<u>Representative Rubin moved, seconded by Representative Wolfe Moore to report SB 299 out favorably for</u> passage. <u>Representative Rubin moved his balloon amendment, seconded by Representative Gatewood</u> (<u>Attachment 6</u>). Representative Rubin explained his amendment. Doug Jorgensen of ABC said they were OK with the amendment. <u>The motion carried.</u>

<u>Representative Rubin moved a second amendment to strike on page 1, lines34 and 35 the words "which</u> may include all premises which are in close proximity and are under the control of the applicant or licensee", and move the new language on page 10, line 25 to page 1, line 34, seconded by Representative <u>Wolfe Moore</u>. The revisor, Mike Heim said that language would work. <u>The Rubin motion carried</u>. We are back on the bill as amended.

Representative Gregory objected to the bill as a whole. Representative Howell also objected to the bill. <u>*The motion to pass SB 299 as amended carried.*</u> Representatives Gregory and Howell asked to be recorded as 'no' votes.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:53 p.m.
