Copies of the minutes for January 30 and 31 and February 1, 2, 6, 7 and 8 were distributed for the Committee's approval.

<u>A motion for approval of the minutes was made by Senator Teichman and seconded by Senator Vratil.</u> <u>The motion passed.</u>

<u>SB 393 – relating to Governor's Career and Technical Education Plan</u>.

Jason Long offered an explanation to the Committee of the proposed amendments to <u>SB 393</u>. (<u>Attachments 1 and 2</u>).

<u>A motion was made by Senator Vratil regarding New Section 9 of **SB 393**, for a technical cleanup to be <u>made in the bill's language</u>. Senator Teichman seconded the motion which passed on a voice vote.</u>

<u>Through a motion by Senator Vratil and seconded by Senator Teichman, a balloon was adopted which</u> <u>deleted portions of the bill changing the manner in which vocational education funding was provided</u> <u>to school districts, which restored the current 0.5 vocation education weighting funding formula. This</u> <u>balloon also eliminates the 30 mile rule" in the bill. The motion passed. Senators Wagle and Abrams</u> <u>wished for their no votes to be recorded.</u>

Senator Schmidt moved for the adooption of a balloon amendment that defined the terms: "individual career plan of study, fees and tuition and articulation agreement." The motion was seconded by Senator Hensley and passed.

<u>A motion was made by Senator Teichman and seconded by Senator Vratil that Substitute for SB 393 be</u> passed as amended. The motion carried.

<u>SB 69 – relating to bullying and dating violence.</u>

Senator Schodorf presented three amendments to <u>SB 69</u> which required a plan for addressing bullying in school districts to be developed by districts' site councils with input from parents and a host of other stakeholders, (<u>Attachment 3</u>); that required districts send bullying plans to the Department of Education and that the Department keep the plans on file, (<u>Attachment 4</u>) and that the plans be posted on districts' web sites and provided to parents of district children annually, (<u>Attachment 5</u>).

Senator Vratil made a motion and Senator Hensley seconded it to adopt Senator Schodorf's amendments. The motion passed.

Senator Vratil recommended **SB 69** favorable for passage, Senator Umbarger seconded the motion which passed.

The Chair explained the process of passing a bill out of Committee, requested any additional testimony as a proponent or opponent and seeing none, announced the meeting adjourned at 2:25 pm.
