# **Introduction of Bills**

Gary Hallmark, Deputy Secretary for Disability and Behavioral Health Services, requested a bill introduction regarding clinic addiction counselors to practice without a clinic.

Senator Ostmeyer moved that this request should be introduced as a committee bill. Senator Longbine seconded the motion. <u>The motion carried</u>.

# SB 399 – Kansas workers and community partnership act, undocumented aliens

Chairman Brungardt continued the hearing on **<u>SB 399</u>**.

Rene Slinkard, Kansas Citizens for Immigration Law enforcement, appeared as an opponent on the bill. (<u>Attachment 1</u>) Ms. Slinkard stated that there is not a shortage of workers in the business workplace, and that business owners initiative is to hire low income workers who are willing to work for less; and the Kansas citizen is forced to pick up the remainder of the income and expenses to support the illegal aliens. A petition was provided and an article from VDare.com.

W. Paul Degener, Topeka, Kansas, spoke in opposition to the bill. (<u>Attachment 2</u>) Mr. Degener stated that by providing a lawful work force for Kansas industries, that the state will make illegal aliens (law breakers) into a lawful work force.
