The Chairman turned the Committee's attention to **<u>SB 422–Relating to judges pro tem</u>**.

<u>Senator King moved, Senator Lynn seconded, that the bill be amended by adoption of the balloon labeled</u>. <u>sb422_king_balloon</u>. (Attachment 1).

Senator King explained that the amendment clarified the language in subsection (a).

Senator King's motion was adopted.

Senator Schodorf moved, Senator King seconded, that SB 422 be passed, as amended. Motion adopted.

The Chairman turned the Committee's attention to <u>SB 423–Supreme court authority to allocate judicial</u> resources, including assignment of judges.

Senator King distributed copies of a proposed amendment which would reinsert language specifying the names of cities in which is required to be held. (<u>Attachment 2</u>).

Senator King moved, Senator Umbarger seconded, that **SB** 423 be amended by reinserting the stricken language which specified the names of cities in which court is required to be held. Motion adopted.

Senator King distributed copies of a proposed amendment relating to the assignment of judges in judicial districts in which the number of judges is equal to or greater than the number of counties in the district. (Attachment 3).

Senator Vratil stated the amendment would limit the Court's authority to maximize the used of judges within a district.
