SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2452 by House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2452 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2452 would allow the Governor, by proclamation, to direct the Secretary of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism to issue no more than 12 big game special permits per year to persons or organizations chosen by the Governor. These permits would be for whitetail or mule deer and would be valid statewide and in any season.

Deer permits for residents can be purchased over the counter for \$30. For non-residents, the cost is \$300 plus a \$20 application fee. Passage of HB 2452 would reduce revenue to the Wildlife Fee Fund by an amount ranging from \$360, if all the permits were awarded to residents, to \$3,840, if all the permits were awarded to non-residents. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2452 is not reflected in *The FY 2013 Governor's Budget Report*.
