SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2471 by House Committee on Aging and Long Term Care

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2471 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2471 would change the make-up of the Board of Adult Care Home Administrators, which is housed at the Department of Health and Environment, so that the seven members appointed by the Governor would be chosen in the following manner:

- 1. Two members would be representatives of professions concerned with the care of the chronically ill or infirm elderly patients;
- 2. Two members would be consumer representatives with no current or previous involvement in the financial affairs, regulation, or licensure of any adult care home;
- 3. Three members must be licensed in Kansas as licensed adult care home administrators with the following requirements:
  - (a) One would have to be a representative of the not-for-profit adult care home industry in Kansas, and LeadingAge Kansas would be required to submit for consideration at least one but not more than three names of such persons to the Governor;
  - (b) One would have to be a representative of the for-profit adult care home industry in Kansas. The Kansas Health Care Association would be required to submit for consideration at least one but not more than three names of such persons to the Governor; and
  - (c) One would have to be a representative of the professional association for the adult care home industry in Kansas. The association would be required to submit for consideration at least one but not more than three names of such persons to the Governor.

All members would be required to be actively engaged in the administration of adult care homes in Kansas and all would be required to be a member of the Kansas Adult Care Executives Association.

The Department of Health and Environment indicates that passage of the bill would have no fiscal effect.
